The wedding at cana

Bible Reading

Jesus, his mum and his disciples had been invited to a wedding at Cana in Galilee. When the wine ran out, Jesus' mum told him and Jesus replied, "You must not tell me what to do, my time has not yet come." Jesus' mum then told the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." There were six stone water jars, each one large enough to hold between twenty and thirty gallons which were used for ritual washing. Jesus told the servants, to fill the jars with water. They filled them to the brim, and then he told them, "Now draw some water out and take it to the man in charge of the feast." They took him the water, which now had turned into wine, and he tasted it. He did not know where this wine had come from (but, of course, the servants who had drawn out the water knew); so he called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone else serves the best wine first, but you have kept the best wine until now!"

You can find this in the Bible, in the book of John, chapter 2, verse 1-11

Creative Prayer 1 ≈ Fizzy Prayers

In the Bible Jesus did many miracles that transformed people's lives, changing them as they came to know how much God loves them.

Put some white vinegar into two or three cups with a few drops of food colouring or paint to colour it. Put some baking soda in a dish or baking tray, just a thin layer to cover the bottom. Choose a colour of vinegar that represents yourself or someone you would like to pray for, then drop a spoon full of vinegar on to the baking soda and watch it Fizz! Pray for yourself or the other person, that God will be with them and help them with anything they need to change and transform them with the Holy Spirit. Repeat with another person and different colour. For this activity you could also use Mentos and Lemonade. Or cheap effervescent tablets like vitamins or Alka-seltzer with water would also so work.



Creative Prayer 1 ≈ Colour Change Spinner Prayers

You will need paper, scrap card e.g. cereal box, some coloured pens or pencils, glue and a piece of string or thick thread.

Get a small plate or bowl, about 10-12cm in diameter, draw and cut out two paper circles. Colour in your circles any way you wish. The colours will "mix" on any pattern that has circles moving out from the middle. Be bold and experiment with different designs and patterns. Stick the first circle on cardboard and cut round it. Stick the second circle on to the back. Make two small holes, about 1cm apart, if not 8mm, on either side of the centre of the circle. Thread string or thread about 40cm in length through and tie. Hold each end of the string and spin it round so that the string twists up. When it is twisted either side, hold it tight and let it unwind. Watch the colours blend and change.

As the colour spinner spins, think about change. Is there something in your life you would like to change? As the colour spinner spins talk to God about the changes you would like to make.



Activity 2 ≈ Do This, Do That

Mary told the servants to do what Jesus said and this game is called **Do This, Do That**. It's a bit like Simon Says and you will need at least one other player to play with. . So does an action for the group to copy and says "do this" or "do that". "Do this" means the players should copy the action whilst "do that" means they should ignore the latest action and carry on the one they are already doing. Anyone who is caught out is, well, out. You can take it in turns to be the leader.



So for example, if you were playing with me and I put my hands on my hips saying 'do this', you should do it **but** if I put my hands on my hips and said 'do that', you should keep your hands by your side.

Activity 2 ≈ Celebration food

I wonder what Jesus had to eat at the wedding at Cana? Make some celebration food by choosing something you really like to eat and making it a little bit special. That might mean decorating a biscuit or cutting some fruit into smaller pieces so you can make them into a pattern or picture. Maybe you could arrange some vegetables on a plate in their separate colours. Be as creative as you like!
