Lesson ideas	Find out about how people from the past used Art in their everyday lives. Investigate different types of Roman mosaics, frescos pottery and jewellery. Experiment with clay and wire to make the bust of a Roman emperor/goddess. (Work together to make larger models in groups.) Make a Roman clay pot and paint a traditional scene or pattern on it. Collage a Roman mosaic out of different materials. Experiment with different 3D materials to make a piece of Roman jewellery. Design a repeated pattern and print it with a Roman theme	Investigate the artwork of Hans Holbein. Look at the features of his portrait paintings. Look closely at the portrait of Henry VIII and what it tell us about the artist and the sitter. Learn how to sketch a portrait of the face/whole body in proportion. Experiment with sketching and drawing self portraits. Paint their own portrait of a contemporary famous person influenced by the style of Holbein.	Find out about Salvador Dali paintings and artwork. Investigate surrealism and discuss whether Art always need to make sense and be a visual representation of what we see. Look at The Persistence of Memory and discuss opinions and ideas about it. Investigate different lines and form and experiment with trying to draw every objects in a melted soft form over hard lines. Paint their own natural world background and place incongruous collage pictures over the top to make their own surrealist picture.
